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Articles of Faith

We Believe...

There is but one living and true God... Jesus Christ is the Son of God, and that He is God in human flesh;

The Holy Spirit indwells every believer in Jesus Christ;

Salvation is offered freely to all who receive Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord;

The church (body of believers) is God's presence in this world today;

The Holy Bible is the inspired, infallible, and authoritative written Word of God;

There is but one God, eternally existent in three persons: God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit.

In the deity of our Lord Jesus Christ, His virgin birth, sinless life, and His atoning death and redemptive work at the cross;

His bodily resurrection, ascension and presence now at the right hand of the Father...and His eventual return to Earth in power and glory and final triumph over death and Satan;

The "Blessed Hope" in the rapture of the Church and Christ's second coming;

That the only means of being cleansed from sin is through repentance and faith in the (atoning) Blood of Jesus Christ;

That regeneration by the Holy Spirit is essential for personal salvation.

The Holy ordinances of water baptism by immersion and communion.

In the baptism in and with the Holy Spirit; and

In the Resurrection of both the saved and the lost... The one to everlasting life and the other to everlasting damnation.

Preamble

I. We Are a Communion of Churches

The Eagles Rock Communion of Christian Leaders (ERCCL) is a global network of leaders from every discipline committed to high standards of excellence in leadership development and personal growth. We are a family of churches, ministries and businesses joined together in common faith and discipline in the apostolic order and structure. This structure emphasizes the continuing apostolic ministry and succession of authority through bishops, overseers, pastors, elders, ministers, and deacons.

The Eagles Rock Communion of Christian Leaders expands its reach beyond the four walls of the church by partnering Christian business leaders and para-church ministry leaders with pastors and churches. We believe that when we work cooperatively to strengthen Christian leadership both inside and outside of the organized church, we strengthen the communities in which we all live.

Our communion's beliefs are distinctively centered on the convergence of the primary spiritual streams of Evangelicalism, Sacramentalism, and Pentecostalism. Furthermore, our beliefs are in continuity with the apostolic tradition which holds as its highest priority, the cooperative fulfillment of the great commission in Matthew 28: 16-20...

¹⁶ Then the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain where Jesus had told them to go. ¹⁷ When they saw him, they worshiped him; but some doubted. ¹⁸ Then Jesus came to them and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. ¹⁹ Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰ and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

II. Our Vision

The vision of the Eagles Rock Communion of Christian Leaders is "to build an international communion of leaders depicting the evangelical, sacramental, and charismatic converge for the fulfillment of the great commandment in Mark 12: 29-31 and the great commission in Matthew 28: 19-20).

i. We are **Evangelical**, stressing salvation by faith in the atoning death of Jesus Christ through personal conversion, the authority and inerrancy of the Bible, the necessity of evangelism at home and abroad, the priesthood of the believer, and the importance of Spirit-anointed preaching and teaching of the Holy scriptures to win souls through the saving grace of Jesus Christ.

- ii. We are **Sacramental**, practicing the historically recognized rites, which are vital to worship and have been preserved and practiced throughout the ages. We therefore highly value the sacraments and sacramentalism, utilize the primary ancient creeds, and encourage the use of a liturgy based on biblical and historic traditions along with historic ceremony and Christian symbolism.
- iii. We are **Pentecostal**, emphasizing the free expression of the gifts and person of the Holy Spirit; especially in expressive praise and in the signs and wonders, the infilling of the Holy Spirit, personal spiritual growth in holiness, and everyone's individual call to ministry. We have an absolute commitment to endeavor toward the completion of the Great Commission--evangelism and discipleship of the spiritually lost are of the highest importance.

Our evangelical commitment involves aggressive church planting; especially among the under-evangelized and unreached nations and communities of the world. We also have a vigorous devotion to training a generation of young people to fulfill their God-given destiny. Additionally, we have an unflinching resolve to recognize and promote the priesthood of all believers through the five-fold ministry. We are equally devoted to the biblical ministries of physical healing, ministry to the poor, providing for the needy and the mending of all human divisions.

III. Our Mission

Our mission is to prepare global 21st century leaders to embrace their kingdom assignment and complete their purpose in the earth.

ERCCL was established to be a force multiplier in the advancing of God's Kingdom. Committed to the tenets of the Christian faith as established in the Word of God, ERCCL upholds the biblical standard of truth and righteousness and serves as a beacon of light and prophetic voice to the nations. This dynamic and expansive Christian network extends nationally and internationally with established and flourishing covenantal churches, para-churches and businesses throughout the world.

IV. Common Elements of Eagles Rock Communion of Christian Leaders

We believe there is a multitude of valid expressions of Christ's Church. We follow God's call to provide an expression of His church in holding certain core beliefs that are distinctively centered on the convergence of the primary historical streams of Evangelism, Sacramentalism and Pentecostalism. The particular blend of these historic streams will be left to the discretion of the bishop and presbyters of a local church--but an acknowledgement of the value and some specific expression of each of these elements are necessary for membership in this communion.

Accordingly, the common elements of the ERCCL are:

- i. A restored dedication to the sacraments, especially the Lord's Table;
- ii. An identification and connection with the historical Church, particularly the Church of the first four centuries;
- iii. A love and embrace for the whole church and a desire to see increased unity and cooperation within the church;
- iv. The blending of the unique practices of the historic streams is evident--each church approaches convergence from its own views and emphasis;
- v. An interest in a harmonious mixture of structure, symbolism, biblical preaching and spirit-led worship;
- vi. A comprehensive commitment to the Great Commandment in Mark 12:29-31 and to the Great Commission in Matthew 28:19-20;
- vii. An unflinching resolve to recognize and promote the priesthood of all believers according to Ephesians 2:10;
- viii. A vigorous devotion to train a generation of young people to fulfill their Godgiven destiny as noted in Psalms 78:4;
- ix. A strong emphasis on evangelism according to Acts 1:8; and
- x. A strong commitment to worldwide missions identified in Matt. 28:18-19.

Our Functions As A Ministry Covering

Our ministerial covering functions include spiritual relationship building, fellowship, leadership, teamwork, mentorship, and church development and strengthening collaboration opportunities among pastors, church members and business leaders.

We also take an active role in helping to collectively and continuously build and spiritually strengthen the pastors, leaders, church members and business leaders in their endeavors to be well-rounded and spiritually strong in the *equipping of the saints for the work of the ministry* according to Eph. 4: 11-12.

What we ask from our churches and leaders

Annual assessments. There is no annual assessment. However, each member church and its leaders (bishops, overseers, pastors) are encouraged to give a monthly offering which goes to support the annual summit, missions, and other ministry endeavors of the communion.

Likewise, each church body is also encouraged to give an annual offering.

Events you and your church leadership should attend are listed below, but are not limited to:

- The Bi-annual Marriage Conference Pastors and Leadership in the Spring of the year; and
- The Annual Leadership Conference/Summit Open to all leaders, businesses and the entire congregation (normally held during the third week in August each year).

Our ask of each ERCCL church, ministry, pastor, and leader:

- Fully agree with operation of the five-fold ministry in today's church according to Ephesians 4:11 as well as all spiritual gifts outlined in 1 Corinthians 12;
- Attend scheduled ERCCL meetings and training sessions;
- Attend and participate in monthly pastoral conference calls;
- Comply with and fulfill any administrative requests and responsibilities from the adjutant team or the ERCCL Administrator; and
- Support ERCCL prayerfully and through your financial support.

The Doctrine of Our Communion

I. Conceptual Expressions

The Church is the Body of Christ. Conceptions of the nature and essence of the Church have varied throughout Christian history as man has sought to respond to the presence of the risen Lord in the congregation. Guidance to the conceptual expression of the Universal Church within His Communion is found in the Preamble to the Cannons, as well as in "Our Distinctives".

II. Creedal Expressions

We subscribe to the spirit and content of the following ancient creedal expressions as representing the faith of the Church Universal:

The Apostle's Creed. We believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth. We believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit and born of the virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to hell. The third day he rose again from the dead. He ascended to heaven and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty. From there he will come to judge the living and the dead. We believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Christian church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting, Amen.

The Nicene Creed. We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth, of all that is seen and unseen. We believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father; God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God; begotten not made, one in being with the Father.

The Creed of Athanasius. We worship one God in trinity and the Trinity in unity, neither confusing the persons nor dividing the divine being. For the Father is one person, the Son is another, and the Spirit is still another. But the deity of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit is one, equal in glory, coeternal in majesty. What the Father is, the Son is, and so is the Holy Spirit. Uncreated is the Father; uncreated is the Son; uncreated is the Spirit. The Father is infinite; the Son is infinite; the Holy Spirit is infinite. Eternal is the Father; eternal is the Son; eternal is the Spirit: And yet there are not three eternal beings, but one who is eternal; as there are not three uncreated and unlimited beings, but one who is uncreated and unlimited. Almighty is the Father; almighty is the Son; almighty. Thus, the Father is God; the Son is God; the Holy Spirit is God: And yet there are not three gods, but one God. Thus, the Father is Lord; the Son is Lord; the Holy Spirit is Lord: And yet there are not three lords, but one Lord.

As Christian truth compels us to acknowledge each distinct person as God and Lord, so catholic religion forbids us to say that there are three gods or lords. The Father was neither made nor created nor begotten; the Son was neither made nor created, but was alone begotten of the Father; the Spirit was neither made nor created, but is proceeding from the Father and the Son. Thus, there is one Father, not three fathers; one Son, not three sons; one Holy Spirit, not three spirits. And in this Trinity, no one is before or after, greater or less than the other; but all three persons are in themselves, coeternal and coequal; and so we must worship the Trinity in unity and the one God in three persons. Whoever wants to be saved should think thus about the Trinity. It is necessary for eternal salvation that one also faithfully believe that our Lord Jesus Christ became flesh.

For this is the true faith that we believe and confess: That our Lord Jesus Christ, God's Son, is both God and man. He is God, begotten before all worlds from the being of the Father, and he is man, born in the world from the being of his mother existing fully as God, and fully as man with a rational soul and a human body; equal to the Father in divinity, subordinate to the Father in humanity. Although he is God and man, he is not divided, but is one Christ. He is united because God has taken humanity into himself; he does not transform deity into humanity. He is completely one in the unity of his person, without confusing his natures. For as the rational soul and body are one person, so the one Christ is God and man.

He suffered death for our salvation. He descended into hell and rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead. At his coming all people shall rise bodily to give an account of their own deeds. Those who have done good will enter eternal life, those who have done evil will enter eternal fire. This is the catholic faith. One cannot be saved without believing this firmly and faithfully.

III. Unity Expressions

We are dedicated to unity and cooperation with the Universal Body of Christ. Our catholicity is further expressed by relating to the ancient, undivided, universal Christian church and claiming historical continuity from it. We network with others in the faith and hold as our goal to be in inter-communion relationship with all branches of Christ's church. We therefore uphold this principle as a historical model for unity within the body of Christ and essential statements proclaimed in the Chicago-Lambeth Quadrilateral of 1886 and 1888 and we subscribe to its spirit and content as put forth by the Bishops of the Protestant Episcopal Church in the United States at that time.

We, as bishops in the church of God, do hereby solemnly declare to all whom it may concern, and especially to our fellow Christians of the different communions in this land who, in their several spheres, have contended for the religion of Christ:

- i. Our earnest desire that the Savior's prayer, "That we all may be one," may, in its deepest and truest sense, be speedily fulfilled;
- ii. That we believe that all who have been duly baptized with water, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost, are members of the Holy Catholic Church;
- iii. That in all things of human ordering or human choice, relating to modes of worship and discipline, or to traditional customs, this Church is ready in the spirit of love and humility to forego all preferences of her own; and
- iv. That this Church does not seek to absorb other communions, but rather, cooperating with them based on a common Faith and Order, to discountenance schism, to heal the wounds of the Body of Christ, and to promote the charity which is the chief of Christian graces and the visible manifestation of Christ to the world.

But, furthermore, we do hereby affirm that the Christian unity can be restored only by the return of all Christian communions to the principles of unity exemplified by the undivided Catholic Church during the first ages of its existence, which principles we believe to be the substantial deposit of Christian faith and order committed by Christ and his apostles to the church unto the end of the world; and therefore incapable of compromise or surrender by those who have been ordained to be its stewards and trustees for the common and equal benefit of all men.

As inherent parts of this sacred deposit, and therefore as essential to the restoration of unity among the divided branches of Christendom, we account the following, to wit:

- i. The Holy Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments are the revealed Word of God;
- ii. The Apostle's Creed, as the Baptismal Symbol;
- iii. The Nicene Creed as the sufficient statement of Christian faith;
- iv. The two Sacraments, Water Baptism, and the Supper of the Lord, ministered with unfailing use of Christ's words of institution and of the elements ordained by Him; and
- v. The Historic Episcopate, locally adapted in the methods of its administration to the varying needs of the nations and peoples called of God into the unity of His Church.

Furthermore, deeply grieved by the sad divisions which affect the Christian church in our own land, we hereby declare our desire and readiness, so soon as there shall be any authorized response to this Declaration, to enter into brotherly conference with all or any Christian bodies seeking the restoration of the organic unity of the Church, with a view to the earnest study of the conditions under which so priceless a blessing might happily be brought to pass.

IV. Doctrinal Expressions

The "Articles of Faith," expressing doctrinal guidance for both the individual members and the institutions and ministers of the ERCCL are found in the Holy Bible.

The Holy Bible-both Old and New Testament is our all-sufficient rule of faith and practice. This statement of doctrinal truths is intended to be a basis of fellowship among us (i.e., that we all speak the same thing according to 1 Corinthians 1:10 and Acts 2:42). The phraseology employed in this statement is not inspired or contended for, but the truth set forth is held to be essential.

V. Doctrine on Marriage

Marriage shall be defined as a union between a biological man and a biological woman according to Genesis 1:26-28...

²⁶ Then God said, "Let Us make man in Our image, according to Our likeness; let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, over the birds of the air, and over the cattle, over all the earth and over every creeping thing that creeps on the earth." ²⁷ So God created man in His own image; in the image of God He created him; male and female He created them. ²⁸ Then God blessed them, and God said to them, "Be fruitful and multiply; fill the earth and subdue it; have dominion over the fish of the sea, over the birds of the air, and over every living thing that moves on the earth."

and Matthew 19: 4-6 which says...

⁴ And He answered and said to them, "Have you not read that He who made them at the beginning made them male and female, ⁵ and said, 'For this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh. ⁶ So then, they are no longer two but one flesh. Therefore, what God has joined together, let not man separate.

It is therefore established within ERCCL that under absolutely no circumstances shall members of our clergy either perform same sex marriages or bless same sex unions.

III. What Our Organization Offers:

I. Monthly Membership Call

Our organizations offers a monthly ministry membership call which is a meeting with our Prelate, our associate bishops, overseers, pastors and ministry leaders. The ministry call normally includes:

- i. A coverage of any announcements, administrative support requirements or guidance from the ERCCL Bishopric, First Administrative Assistant to the Prelate Bishop; announcements or administrative guidance from the ERCCL Adjutants and coverage of administrative updates or guidance from the ERCCL Adjutants Administrator;
- ii. Updates and guidance from the ERCCL Overseers within their areas of ministry or geographic influence;
- iii. A message of overall spiritual guidance from the ERCCL Prelate or designee; and
- iv. An offering of corporate prayer for the churches and ministries of ERCCL for their strength and spiritual well-being, as well as their individual and personal needs.

II. Spiritual Covering

We provide a spiritual covering for our churches and ministries by:

- i. Providing ready and continuous spiritual guidance as needed to ERCCL churches, ministries, pastors, elders, leaders, and lay leaders to assure doctrinal standards are upheld and administered through its churches and ministries based solely on the Holy Bible and not any person's or leader's personal preferences;
- ii. Offering and/or providing standardized spiritual instruction and training required for ordination and/or elevation to the offices of the five-fold ministry within ERCCL;
- iii. Continuously building the spiritual strength, spiritual education and spiritual undergirding of our churches and ministries through delivery and encouraging wide participation in our annual summit/leadership conference;
- iv. Providing spiritual covering, advice, and personal ministry consultation for pastors, upon request;
- v. Providing education and training opportunities and programs through bible colleges and institutes partnered with ERCCL; and
- vi. Assisting ERCCL churches and ministries with administration and training of its church leaders to operate their ministries in full compliance with both state and federal laws.

The Structure of Our Communion

I. Relational Consensus

ERCCL is a relational communion that places emphasis on the collective promotion and support of its churches, ministries, and businesses. We emphasize mutual submission and accountability not only in our actions and ventures as a communion, but ultimately to The Lord our God under the guidance of the Holy Spirit. We actively and collectively seek the direction of the Holy Spirit in everything we do and encourage our churches, ministries, and businesses to do the same.

II. Implementation of the Communion's Structure

It is recognized that although the full organizational structure must be ordered from the inception of the Provisional Canons, the structure, placement and utilization of the communion's members will constantly be adjusted in an effort to eventually structure the communion according to the Provisional Canons and ultimately, under the guidance of the Holy Spirit as God speaks to the communion through our Prelate, as well as collectively through our bishops, overseers, pastors and elders. Many of our future functions will evolve and be implemented as the communion grows and expands.

- i. Authority of the Churches. ERCCL churches operate under the spiritual authority of their respective senior pastors and their congregational presbytery (council of elders, board of trustees, deacons, leadership teams, etc.). The churches are legally autonomous, and as such retain the rights to govern their own financial affairs, own their physical properties, choose to submit to their own Dioceses (authority) and to disaffiliate from our communion, as they are led by the Holy Spirit and deem it necessary.
- **ii. Ministry Focus of the Churches.** ERCCL churches collectively support world missions through the advancement and extension of the Kingdom of God around the globe. We evangelize, perform mission trips, assist in planting churches, and provide continuous pastoral leadership/development, as well as counseling and development of business leaders. Through mission work completed in the United States and abroad, pastors, church leaders and church laity synergistically focus on empowering and equipping the body of Christ to fulfill the great commission expressed in Matthew 28:18-20...

¹⁸ And Jesus came and spoke to them, saying, "All authority has been given to Me in heaven and on earth. ¹⁹ Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰ teaching them to observe all things that I have commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age." Amen.

The Bishopric

The Bishopric serves the communion as the senior presbytery for ERCCL convening as a council to provide and execute The Lord's vision and direction for the communion. The ERCCL Bishop's Council is the governing body of the communion and is led by the Presiding Prelate Bishop with assistance from several Suffragan Bishops operating in disparate areas covering key geographical and mission focused areas of the communion. The key operational areas of the Suffragan Bishops include administrative assistance, protocol, geographical ministry oversight and spiritual leadership throughout the United States and several countries on the continent of Africa.

The Overseers

The overseers are appointed by the Presiding Prelate Bishop of the communion and are primarily responsible for the provision of spiritual advice and coordination of spiritual issues for the churches and ministries within his or her purview. Overseers should energetically establish relationships with the pastors and leaders within their regions or areas of responsibility to provide a "first-line of response" in providing prayer and assistance to the churches and ministries within their sphere of influence. Their roles should be strictly advisory in nature as each pastor is spiritually responsible directly to The Lord for the direction, leadership and management of their churches.

Overseers should also be available to provide continuous spiritual and practical advice/support to individual church pastors and ministries, when requested, in their efforts to establish their fledgling ministries. They should be available to provide guidance in the administration and training of church leadership to be in full compliance with both state/federal laws and financial responsibilities.

The Adjutancy



The Administrator



Our Organizational Structure


Eagles Rock Communion of Christian Leaders
